

THE SIMMONS FAMILY OF LINCOLN PARISH, LOUISIANA

Elizabeth SIMMONS, her two sons James and Asa Bailey, and her daughter Hannah move from Meriwether County, Georgia to Vienna, Lincoln Parish, (Formerly Jackson Parish) Louisiana. In Jackson Parish Louisiana History it states that Asa Bailey SIMMONS "... he received his education and began his career of a planter in his native state, where he lived until 1849, when he removed to Louisiana and located on a plantation two miles from Vienna, when ... During the war Asa B. SIMMONS was a member of an organization of home guards. A prohibitionist from principle, he was long identified with the temperance association. He married in 1839(Ed. note 1838) to Miss Temperance STERLING, also a native of Georgia." Much of the above can be said of Asa's brother James SIMMONS.

The 1850 census shows both brothers as farmers. Asa's farm was valued at \$120.00 and James's farm at \$150.00. The next ten years brought a great deal of prosperity to the two brothers. The 1860 census of Jackson Parish, Louisiana shows for Asa B. SIMMONS real estate valued at \$6700.00 and personal estate valued at \$500.00. James SIMMONS real estate valued at \$8000.00 and personal estate valued \$1275.00. Mrs. Olga BROTHERS TEAGUE, great-great-granddaughter of Asa states that Asa owned 40 slaves in a letter dated 31 Aug 1965 and written to Mrs. Charles NEWTON of Georgia.

During the Civil War, Asa Bailey SIMMONS JR. (named for his uncle) son of James SIMMONS enlisted as a private in K Company, 2nd Louisiana Infantry. He died the 24 June 1861 in Yorktown, Virginia. James like his brother Asa most likely enlisted in the Home Guard. Asa Bailey SIMMONS had two sons enlist in the Army, James Isaac and Jesse A. both of whom enlisted in I Company 28th Louisiana (Gray's). They are all listed in Roster of Civil War Soldiers of Louisiana. In 1865 Asa Bailey SIMMONS was taxed \$2.70 and James SIMMONS was taxed \$0.60 according to The Civil War tax in Louisiana 1865.

The 1870 census of Jackson Parish, Louisiana shows the devaluation of the land and property to the Southerners. James SIMMONS SR. had Real Estate valued at \$625.00 and Personal Estate valued at \$530.00. Asa Bailey SIMMONS had lost everything, but his son James Isaac SIMMONS and family were living with him. James Isaac SIMMONS had real and personal estate valued at \$2800.00. The 1870 census lists six SIMMONS households all of which were related the each other. Two nephews of James and Asa SIMMONS moved to the Vienna, Louisiana area during the 1860'S. They were Jesse A. and Henry James SIMMONS, the sons of Jesse & Frances (PITTARD) SIMMONS.

The following decade began the exit of several of the SIMMONS families to Texas, but some families remained in the area. The 1880 census of Vienna, Lincoln Parish (Formerly Jackson Parish) listed three sons of Asa Bailey SIMMONS as heads of households. They were Jesse A., Josiah 'Joe', and Abel A. SIMMONS. James SIMMONS SR. and his son Mortimore were listed as heads of household. Also the two brothers Jesse A. and Henry James SIMMONS were also listed as heads of household.

By the 1900 census I could only find two families with the SIMMONS surname living in the Vienna area. In Ward 1, Ruston, LA., lived Josiah 'Joe' SIMMONS (son of Asa), and Mortimore SIMMONS (son of James SIMMONS SR.)

James⁴SIMMONS (Adam³JR., Adam²SR., John¹)

James was born in Oglethorpe County, Georgia and married Lucinda ___ by 1838 in Georgia. He and his brother Asa Bailey SIMMONS moved to Louisiana in late 1849 as stated in the previous page. The place and date of death for James or Lucinda has not been found. They could have moved to Texas after the 1880 census was taken. James and Lucinda SIMMONS's children were:

1. Asa Bailey SIMMONS JR. born 1839 in Meriwether County, Georgia. It is doubtful that he married. He died 24 June 1861 at Yorktown, Virginia. He was a member of K Company, 2nd Louisiana, Infantry.
2. Almeda SIMMONS born 1840.
3. Corintha SIMMONS born 1844.
4. Andrew SIMMONS born 1846 Meriwether County, Georgia. In Roster of Civil War Soldiers in Louisiana it lists a Sergeant Andrew SIMMONS of I Company 2nd La Calvary, this could possibly be him.
5. Victoria SIMMONS born 1848.
6. Sarah SIMMONS born 1850 Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana.
7. Mortimore SIMMONS born 1853 Vienna, LA. He married Nancy A. LANGUELY 23 Nov 1874 in Lincoln Parish, Louisiana. In the 1900 census for Lincoln Parish it lists his family with 8 children born and 5 living. The ones I can identify are listed below all of which were born in the Vienna area:

Asa Bailey⁴SIMMONS (Adam³JR., Adam²SR., John¹)

Asa 'Acie' was born 14 December 1816 in Oglethorpe County, Georgia. He lived there until shortly after his marriage to Temperance 'Temy' STERLING, which took place 28 December 1838. Temy was the daughter of Josiah STERLING and Elizabeth MUCKLEROY. Temy was born 4 July 1819 and died in 1888. Asa and Temy were second cousins on their mother sides. Both were great-grandchildren of Archibald MACKLEROY (MUCKLEROY) and Catherine SIMPSON of North Carolina. Information on the MUCKLEROY (various spellings McELROY) was obtained from David V. MUCKLEROY of San Antonio, Texas. Asa and Temy moved from Meriwether County, Georgia to Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana. They later moved to Texas between 1872-1879, because they are not listed in the 1880 census of Louisiana. Where they moved to in Texas has not been determined, but most likely near their son James. Asa died 1884 in Texas place unknown. They had six sons, the four oldest having been born in Meriwether County, Georgia:

1. James Isaac SIMMONS ,born 30 May 1842, married Hattie Matilda STALLINGS and will be discussed in greater detail in the SIMMONS'S of Texas. See page eleven.
2. Jesse A. SIMMONS, born 29 September 1844, married Mary A. 'Mollie' MALONE. He remained in Louisiana for some years. See page seven.
3. Abel Averhart SIMMONS ,born 7 December 1846, married Susan Ann Catherine SEALY. See page eleven, SIMMONS'S of Texas.
4. William Green SIMMONS, born 10 August 1849, married Mary STALLINGS. Mary is

the sister of the above Hattie Matilda STALLINGS. See page eight for more information.

5. Josiah 'Joe' Sterling SIMMONS born 31 July 1853 in Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana. He married Victoria MORRIS. See page nine for more information.
6. Willis 'Doc' Bennett SIMMONS born 20 February 1856 in Vienna, Louisiana. He married Octavia GLOVER. He will be discussed more in the SIMMONS'S of Texas. See page eleven.

Jesse A.⁵ SIMMONS (Asa B.⁴, Adam³ JR., Adam² SR., John¹)

Jesse was born 29 September 1844 in Meriwether County, Georgia the second son of Asa Bailey & Temperance (STERLING) SIMMONS. He married Mary 'Mollie' A. MALONE. The information written next was found in Jackson Parish Louisiana History it states "J.A. SIMMONS of Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana ... the immediate subject of this sketch, was married 7 June 1865, to Miss Mary A. MALONE, who was born in Louisiana, April 1846, and who has borne him nine children, eight of whom are living, the other having died in infancy ... Mr. SIMMONS has been a life-long planter, and his operation have been attended with moderate success, and in connection with that he has a large store in Vienna in which he keeps an extensive stock of general merchandise. His plantation is located about two miles west of Vienna and consists of 500 acres of good and well-improved land. His principle crops are cotton and corn. In 1868 he became a member of the Vienna lodge, No. 106, A.F. & A.M., and having taken the requisite number of degrees is a master Mason. He and his wife are both members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1862, when in his eighteenth year, Mr. SIMMONS enlisted in Company I, of the Twenty-eight Louisiana Infantry, under Captain Richards, and served gallantly until the close of the war, but with such good fortune that he was never wounded, though he was in many engagements, including those at Camp Bislin, Mansfield, Pleasant Hill Landing and Sims Port."

It is not known where and when Jesse and Mary died, they could have been buried on a private cemetery or moved to Texas. Paul Earnest BAKER (grand-nephew of Jesse) provided some information on this family thru a brief work he did. Jesse and Mary children, all of which were born in Vienna, Louisiana were:

6. Willis 'Pete' J. SIMMONS, born 4 May 1876. He married 1 July 1900 in Denton County, Texas to Della PINER. Willis also came to Texas in 1893 with his brother. The 1910 census of Denton County has him listed as working in a hardware store and owning his own house.

8. Mary 'Kate' E. SIMMONS, born 17 May 1881, married Hulon CROUCH.

William Green 'Billie'⁵ SIMMONS (Asa B.⁴, Adam³ JR., Adam² SR., John¹)

William was born 10 August 1849 in Meriwether County, Georgia. The fourth son of Asa Bailey and Temperance (STERLING) SIMMONS. He married Mary STALLINGS in Texas. Mary was the daughter of Jephtha and Frances J. STALLINGS of Vienna, Louisiana. William and Mary moved back to Texas where he died 24 December 1886 of a heart attack at a Christmas Play. He is buried in Vienna, Louisiana. His wife Mary remarried a older man by the of BISHOP and moved to San Antonio, Texas, where she died at an old age. William and Mary's children were:

Josiah 'Joe' Sterling⁵ SIMMONS (Asa B.⁴, Adam³ JR., Adam² SR., John¹)

Joe was born 31 July 1853 in Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana. He married Victoria MORRIS (28 August 1861 - 16 February 1945) in Lincoln Parish, Louisiana the 6 November 1879. He and his family remained in Vienna area and some of his descendents are still living in the area. Some of his grandchildren and his daughters Norma Lee and Bessie SIMMONS helped with the information on this family. Joe died 22 July 1903 and both he and his wife are buried in Vienna. Their children are:

1. William Sterling SIMMONS, born 28 Jan 1881, died 22 May 1964. He married the 24th of October 1903 in Vienna, to Beatrice SEALY (21 March 1884 - 28 March 1964) the daughter of James Robinson Graves and Mattie E. (BROADWAY) SEALY. William and Beatrice are buried in Vienna. When my family and I took a trip Louisiana we visited with two daughters of William they are Gladys and Mattie Sue. The ladies told us of a trip their father took the family on in the 1930'S to visit cousins in Texas. Clyde Earl SIMMONS JR. of Flower Mound, Texas also recalls the visit of these cousins. The also went to O'Brien, Texas to visit children of Abel SIMMONS. The children of William and Beatrice are:

THE SIMMONS FAMILY OF DENTON & HASKELL TEXAS

Between the years 1872 and 1900 three of Asa Bailey SIMMONS's sons moved to Texas. The first of these was James Isaac SIMMONS and his family. He arrived in Denton County, Texas between 1871-72. The 1870 census of Lincoln Parish, Louisiana has James and family living with his father Asa. The 1880 census of Denton County, Texas lists James's son Willis age eight as being born in Texas. This gives the date of 1871-72. James and his family moved to Flower Mound, Denton County, Texas where he, his wife and several of their children are buried. On a visit to the area in 1989 I visited with a grandson of James who was Clyde Earl SIMMONS Junior. Clyde gave me a copy of work, on the family, done by his cousin Paul Earnest BAKER.

The second son of Asa's that moved to Texas was Willis B. 'Doc' SIMMONS. Willis came with his brother in 1871-72 and is listed in his brothers household in the 1880 census of Denton County. Willis at some point between 1880-95 moved to Oklahoma, where all his children were born. He moved back to Texas prior to 1910 and finally settled in Waxahachie, Texas. Where he lived for many years, finally passing away in 1942.

The third son of Asa's that moved to Texas was Abel Averhart SIMMONS. Abe moved to Denton county, Texas between 1896-98. His oldest daughter Julia married late in 1896 in Louisiana, and his next oldest daughter Tempy married in Denton County, Texas in 1899. According to Wilson LINK (grandson of Abe SIMMONS), Abe lived in Grapevine, Texas, however it was probably Flower Mound and they just used Grapevine as the mailing address. Abe is also listed in the 1900 census of Texas as living in Denton County. Abe then moved to Haskell County, Texas between the towns of O'Brien and Rochester about 1905. In this Haskell County four of his daughters were married. Abe and his wife Susan stayed in Haskell County, except for an occasional visit back to Louisiana. Abel and Susan are buried in Rochester Cemetery, Haskell County, Texas.

Asa Bailey and Temperance also moved to Texas. The date of their departure was prior to 1880, because they are not listed in the census of Louisiana. They may have come with their son James, however at this time their location is unknown. Asa and Tempy are buried in Texas, but the place is unknown.

James Isaac⁵SIMMONS (Asa B.⁴, Adam³JR., Adam² SR., John¹)

The following information was obtained from a work done by Paul Earnest BAKER (grandson of James Isaac). The information was done between the years 1963-69. The only difference in what I have collected is the date of this families arrival in Texas. I place the arrival about three years later than does Paul, however he could have meant that James was in the area looking for a new place to live as early as 1869. The following I will keep as Paul wrote it some twenty years ago.

"James Isaac (Jimmie) SIMMONS, first son (of Asa and Tempy SIMMONS) born in Meriwether County, Georgia in 1841. Moved to Louisiana with his family; served in the Civil War 1861-1865; fought in the battle of Vicksburg on the Mississippi. Married in 1866 in Louisiana to Harriet Matilda (Hattie) STALLINGS, who was born 1842. They had a family of nine children. According to reports, Grandfather's brother-in-law was a slave trader in Louisiana before the Civil War.

Jimmie and Hattie SIMMONS migrated from Vienna, Louisiana to Raleigh, East Texas--- in 1869. After the Civil War the plantation in Louisiana was impractical, so along with other members of the family, Grandfather and Grandmother probably were attracted to Texas by stories of cheap, fertile land and the big, wide-open spaces.

In 1870 they moved further west to the Cross roads, Flower Mound, Denton County, Texas. Grandfather Jephtha STALLINGS (Hattie's father) had come to the area prior to Jimmie and Hattie Here they lived four or five years and then moved to a farm six miles east of Cleburne, Johnson County, Texas. Dr. Joe STALLINGS, (Hattie's brother) after serving four years as an army surgeon in the Civil War, had moved six miles east of Cleburne, but died about this time. Jimmie took part in the settlement of his brother-in-laws's estate.

While in Johnson County, Jimmie and Hattie lived in a log cabin near the Chisholm Trail. They could see the cattle being driven to the railroad and to market at Kansas City along this trail. They hauled water; raised a garden, corn, cotton, chickens, hogs and milch cows.

Jimmie and Hattie moved back to Denton County about 1876 and located north of Grapevine, where they continued to live until after all their children were married. Their first home was a log cabin with a dirt floor, one door and no windows. Then a lean-to was added for a kitchen, later a three-room house was built one-half mile east of the log cabin. Still later, a long kitchen and a large parlor were added.

Later in life Grandfather J.I. SIMMONS and Grandmother Hattie STALLINGS SIMMONS, moved to Stringtown, about two miles east of their old home to be near their sons: Joe and Willie SIMMONS. Here, Grandmother Hattie died November 25, 1924 at the age of 82 and Grandfather Jimmie died May 11, 1925 at the age of 84. They were laid to rest in the Flower mound Cemetery, about five miles southwest of Lewisville, and adjacent to the Flower Mound Church. When "near the end of their", Uncle Joe and Aunt Ollie SIMMONS took them into their home for tender and constant care."

James Isaac and Harriet Matilda 'Hattie' (STALLINGS) SIMMONS children were:

Abel 'Abe' Averhart⁵SIMMONS (Asa B.⁴, Adam³JR., Adam²SR., John¹).

Abe, was born 7 December 1846 in Meriwether County, Georgia. He is the third son of Asa Bailey and Temperance (STERLING) SIMMONS. Abe's parents moved to Vienna, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana in late 1849. When the Civil War started Abe was almost 15 years old, and although he did not join a regular unit like his two older brothers (James and Jesse), he probably joined a Home Guard like his father.

After the Civil War Abe remained in the area, and on the 12th of November 1872 he married Susan Ann Catherine SEALY (10 November 1850 - 1 March 1920). Susan was the daughter of Obadiah Eli and Julia Ann Melvinia (CROSBY) SEALY of Vienna. Susan's parents were originally from South Carolina. Abe and Sue remained in Vienna for about 25 years, when they decided to move to Texas. They first moved to Flower Mound, Denton County, Texas, where they remained until 1905. At this time they moved further west and settled in Haskell County, Texas between the cities of O'Brien and Rochester Texas. Wilson LINK (Grandson of

Abe) said he was a retired school teacher, but in the censuses he is listed as a farmer.

Abe and Sue had collected quite a few photographs through their years together, both of them had pictures of their brothers and sisters dating as early as the 1860'S. They stayed in contact with their respective families as can be seen from the pictures of family members throughout the years, of which a few are in this work. This love of pictures was passed to their daughter Jamie Floice SIMMONS LINK who received those pictures that her parents collected after their deaths and from the pictures she had collected, she remained in contact with cousins from east Texas and Louisiana through her life. These pictures were passed to her daughter Floice LINK McLENDON.

Abe died 23 August 1928, and both he and Sue are buried in Rochester Cemetery, Haskell County, Texas. All of their children were born in Vienna, Louisiana they are:

Jamie Floice⁶ SIMMONS (Abel⁵, Asa B.⁴, Adam³JR., Adam²SR., John¹)

Jamie was born 3 September 1889, in Vienna, Louisiana. She died 23 August 1962, in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She married 15 January 1913 in O'Brien, Texas to John Henry LINK (). John was the son of Thomas & Gillie (COURSEY) LINK. Thomas and Gillie LINK came from Logan County, Kentucky to Haskell County, Texas before the turn of the Century. Jamie separated from her husband prior to her twin daughters being born in 1917. In Fence Lake, New Mexico Area, Families & History her Daughter-in-law Ruth (BOYETT) LINK entered this story about her.

"Mrs. LINK moved from Ruston, Louisiana with her parents and sisters to Texas when she was a little girl. She was living in O'Brien, Texas when she married John Henry LINK whom she later divorced.

Mrs. LINK knew when her four babies were very small that she was going to have to rear them alone and with determination and perserverance she did just that. It was an awesome task because she was not physically strong, had no property or wealth. She taught the children to work hard and instilled in them a sense of intergrity and self-worth and strong family ties. She was blessed with a creative talent for art and for sewing. The oldest daughter, Virginia BRUTON, had moved with her husband, Major, to Fence Lake to homestead and the other LINKs followed them there in 1932. After 24 days on the road in a covered wagon the family arrived on July 10th. Mrs. LINK was practically penniless. But she soon learned that except for a

few World War I pensioners, the other homesteaders were practically penniless, too.'

'Where's the Water

The Bell, Shields and Walker families had access to a dug shallow well but the other homesteaders had to find water any way they could. At first the LINKs hauled water from old Fence Lake in barrels via wagon and team. First they had to catch the horses; the trip to the lake was 3 or 3 1/2 miles from home. Then about 1935 the Fence Lake dried up and water was brought from Atarque Lake in barrels by Frank SPARKMAN who had a truck. He charged 50 per barrel for hauling. Money to pay the freight bill came from Mrs. LINKs (known to her grandchildren as 'Mama LINK') egg and cream money.

The next chapter in the water story found the LINKs hauling their water from Joe AKARD's dirt tank of dam; this went on for some time and it was good to have water this close to home. If "Ole Whiteface" wanted a drink she would place her forelegs up in the wagon and help herself to the water. Of course when there was rain or snow the people would store as much it as possible and that helped out with the water problem.

Finally the LINKs became affluent enough to acquire a stripped-down Model T and that water was taken from Joe's tank to Mrs. LINK's home to make the adobe bricks for her new two-bedroom home which replaced her old picket house.

It was about 1935 when Mr. MEDLOCK drilled the first water well in the village of Fence Lake. It lasted about a year before giving out. Then about 1939, Curly WINNEGAR brought in a good well there at 400 feet. Still later Charlie drilled on down to 700 feet and this well is still pumping water in 1984. Most of the homesteads have their own wells now also. By Ruth (BOYETT) LINK" John and Jamie's children are:
