His wife died in Louisiana in 1856, the mother of six children, and when he came to Texas he located first in Smith county, then lived awhile in Navarro, afterward a season in Denton and finally to Montague county, where he died at the home of his son in 1903. During his active life he was known in local politics, a leader of a minority party. He was first a Democrat, became an adherent of the American or Know-Nothing party, and when it ceased to exist he gave his voice to more or less independence in politics, until the formation of the Populist party, when he cast his lot with it. He was a man of opinions and capable of expressing them intelligently in private or in public, and he had some reputation as a public speaker. In his church relations he was a Missionary Baptist.
